Lighting the Candle of Love

Reader: "While they were there, the time came for Mary to deliver her child." (Luke 1:6)

Mary, with her aching body and sore muscles, looked at Joseph's calloused hands and kind eyes with expectation. For the time had come and Joseph was going to deliver this child. With the firm and gentle caresses that could massage cedar bark until it felt like silk, Joseph soothed the fear and grief that rose when they realized that Mary was going to have to give birth in a barn, with plenty of bleating animals in attendance, but no midwife.

Reader: When their eyes met, Mary's chest filled with gratitude for Joseph's patience, as he gathered the supplies that they would need. For Joseph had hidden her for many months, ensuring her safety. And during those frightening days, Mary's love for her fiancé grew. Now her love was so large, she imagined that it could encompass the world. As Joseph settled Mary onto the hay, the smell of the dry grass itched her nose. Mary knew that Jesus would be born—not in a sterile setting with midwives close at hand—but he would be born in a world of love. Reader: This fourth Sunday of Advent, may we sense the love of God, our friends, and our community surrounding us as we prepare for Christ's birth.

All: We light this candle, as we open ourselves to God's abiding love. May the glow remind us of the adoration that the Holy One has for us.

(Light the first, second, third, and fourth candles.)

Prayer (unison): O God, help us to create a world of love as we await Christ's arrival. Teach us how to mend broken relationships, let go of bitter disputes, and restore our affections. Amen.

Time with the Children

Lesson: Adapted from Matthew 1:1-17

An abridged account of the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham.

Abraham was the father of Isaac, and Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers. Judah fathered children with Tamar and six generations later Salmon was the father of Boaz by Rahab, and Boaz the father of Obed by Ruth, and Obed the father of Jesse, and Jesse the father of King David.

And David was the father of Solomon by the wife of Uriah, and 13 generations later the Hebrew people were exiled to Babylon. Both before and during the exile, there were many prophets and there was a prophecy of a Savior born in Bethlehem.

Twelve generations after the deportation to Babylon: Joseph the husband of Mary, who was cousin to Elizabeth, wife of Zechariah and mother of John the Baptist. God chose Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called the Messiah.
