WHAT WE ARE READING

Throughout the Scripture, we hear of an enduring vision of "new heavens and a new earth" (Is 65:17) where God's justice will reign (see 2 Pt 3:12, Rev 21:1). The Old Testament calls us to care for the land and provide for those who need food, especially those who are poor and outcast. The tradition of the Sabbath Year is one example: "But during the seventh year the land shall have a complete rest, a sabbath for the Lord, when you may neither sow your field nor prune your vineyard" (Lv 25:4). God explains to Moses that the land should be used to provide food for all who need it: "While the land has its sabbath, all its produce will be food equally for you yourself and . . . for your hired help and the tenants who live with you . . ." (Lv 25:6).

From "For I was Hungry & You Gave me Food: Catholic Reflections on Food, Farmers, and Farmworkers" which was published on this date in 2003. It reminds us of our shared faith basis for agricultural justice.
