In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magifrom the east came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star in the east and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him, and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. Community gardens supply nutritious produce where it's most needed, while providing employment and educational opportunities that nurture communities.

Did you know... prior to various cathedrals adapting Services of Lessons and Carols at the end of the 19th century, Christmas carols were normal sung by individuals visiting people's houses. Carols were generally considered secular until the Victorian era, when church musicians introduced carols into worship. The original Service of Lessons and Carols is often attributed to King's College, Cambridge, but Truro Cathedral in Cornwall likely had the first Festival of Lessons and Carols.

Confirmation class is an opportunity for 9th and 10th grade students and older to think about what they believe about God and Christianity, to explore our Presbyterian tradition as well as other Christian and non-Christian traditions, and to think critically about the world around them. At the end of the Confirmation class, students are given the opportunity to become adult members of the Church and "confirm" their baptism (or become baptized if they were not baptized as children).
