In the coming weeks, we will need food donations as well, so please stay tuned!



#### Did you know?.....

The seashell, particularly a scallop shell, is a symbol of baptism in Christianity. Many baptismal fonts are shaped like a shell or decorated with shells. Shells are evocative of early baptisms done near rivers and seashores. For this reason, and for the symbolism of "living water," water used for baptism should be a form of running water. If running water is not available, cold water is considered preferable!
