Woman 2 Woman Offering a Training in October!

This fall marks the tenth anniversary of this prison ministry founded at Bedford Presbyterian Church in 2013.

Over the past decade, they have connected more than 150 women in the community surrounding Bedford Hills Correctional Facility with 130 individuals incarcerated there. Lots of deep and meaningful friendships have been formed.

Unfortunately, there are many people inside the prison who have been waiting a long time for a visitor. There are lots of newly incarcerated people who have heard about W2W's visiting program and are very interested in participating.
