BPC Visioning Team Communication to the Congregation Weekend of Feb 12th

Dear Friends,

As we communicated previously, the Visioning Team commenced our work in January and have met six times since then to study indepth the following Charge:

- How are we called to be church now?
- What, besides Sunday morning worship, do we need to nourish and expand our spiritual lives?
- Where are we called TODAY to take collective action in the world?

We have aligned that Charge and our process to the following outcomes:

- Is the current resource allocation meeting the needs of our Congregation?
- What recommendations do we have regarding resource allocation?
- What can current working groups do to meet the needs identified in the Holy Cow assessment?
- Where do we, as lay representatives of the Congregation, need to focus our energy and efforts in order to meet the needs identified?

This intergenerational group with varied perspectives have gathered with loving hearts and have discerned these big questions in true Christian spirit. We have leaned into tough conversations and difficult topics, respectfully disagreeing at times, always seeking to understand one another, and prayerfully discerning along the way. We have discussed resource allocation and prioritization based on the Holy Cow assessment, the Vision Study (2019) and other data points and observations from our own experiences and perspectives.

We are prepared to make phase I recommendations. These recommendations will be shared with Session and the Personnel

Committee soon, and with you in full detail at the Congregational Meeting. We are eager to share our process and recommendations, knowing that the work is just beginning. We are committed to being a standing working group, should Session approve, to continue to help chart out our short and long term vision for a thriving Bedford Presbyterian Church.




