**Hebrew Bible Lesson** Genesis 32:22-31

The same night he got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ## **Gospel Lesson**

Matthew 14:13-21

When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves."

Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat."

They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish."

And he said, "Bring them here to me." Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and blessed and broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled, and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.



We have been trimming our tomato bushes as we await the fruit to be ready to pick. We have begun to hand-pollinate our corn.

Additionally, our harvests have grown more bountiful. We have been able to harvest all of our garlic and potatoes. We have also begun to harvest cucumbers, squash, and zucchini. We have also been able to harvest more beets, radishes, and carrots. Peppers and tomatoes will be harvested shortly!

#### WHAT WE ARE READING

August 9 is International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples. We are employing indigenous practices in our learning garden. The Three Sisters is the native legend of how the crops corn, beans, and squash came to be grown together in so many different native cultures, and we have them growing together in our learning garden as well. Additionally, the Three Sisters represent what servant-leadership can look like in our community:

Comparing the six determinants of successful cross-sector partnerships with aspects of successful plant partnerships reveals a number of analogies between facilitating collaboration of organizations and gardening. Successful plant combinations have in common that the individual plants share the same soil requirements and have the same need for sunshine—or, if not, that one of the plants provides shade for the other partners.- Dr. Thorsten Grahn
