

Worship Update

Have you wondered why we place the prayers of the people and the offering after the sermon? These are responses to the proclamation that we hear in the reading of scripture and the sermon. God speaks to us, and then we respond with our prayers and our gifts. From the earliest days of the church through the Reformation, Christian worship has been characterized by this movement from divine activity to human response.

This pattern shifted by the 18th century. In a reaction against the perceived influence of Catholicism, and, especially, in an effort to distance themselves from the state sponsored Church of England, Presbyterians combined the various prayers into one long prayer. That prayer and the offering were moved to the middle of the service, and the sermon was placed at the end. The 20th century witnessed a resurgence of interest in following the traditional order of the early church, an order that is now shared by Christians around the world and spanning all major denominations. To help our children live into this pattern of worship, they will now take up the Children's Offering during the choir's first anthem. After hearing the proclamation (The Moment with Children), they will respond with their contributions and service.

Quilt Magic

I'm sure you'll agree it's like magic how a beautiful quilt appears each and every year without fail! How do they do it? This year's quilt, called "Our 40^{th} Anniversary Quilt", measures 98" x 98" and is hand quilted in ruby red and white by the Bedford Presbyterian Church Quilters.
